

Newsletter (8) Friday 7th November 2025



This week we began to focus on the upcoming Act of Remembrance. We shared a special video which explains what Remembrance Day is and why millions of people take time to stop and mark it - Remembrance Day - BBC Teach. The key message was that Remembrance Day is a special day to remember and honour people who have helped to keep peace and protect us, especially those who served and continue to serve in wars. We asked children to focus on the values of peace, kindness and hope for a better future during next week's two minutes' silence. During our Wednesday reflection time children shared their thoughts on these important reflection questions:

- What or who do you feel is important to remember, and why?
- What can we say or do to show we remember someone who has helped us or made a difference?
- How might you promote peace and kindness in your own lives and school community?
- How can we ask God to help us remember the good things and be kind to others every day?

Anning Class

Anning Class have been working hard in Art; learning how to capture different features of the human body in various art forms. We have depicted humans in many different ways throughout the last half term - from realistic sketches of our friends, all the way through to sculpting and manipulating clay and pipe cleaners to create surrealist sculptures. Our pipe cleaner sculptures were inspired by Alberto Giacometti with long, thin and pokey features whereas our short, wide and rounded features made of clay were inspired by Henry Moore's art style. We had lots of fun experimenting with each different art style and enjoyed the challenge of capturing the human form in such a variety of ways.



Attendance

Below is a reminder of our attendance processes:

Attendance Drops Below	What Happens
95%	If this has not been caused due to an extended period of illness and within the Autumn term, your child's class teacher will speak with you and may send a letter informing you of this. We'll invite you to a short meeting to talk through what is happening and complete a support plan.

93%	You'll receive a letter and meet again with the class teacher to create a personalised Early Intervention Plan.
90% (Persistent Ahsence)	You'll be invited to meet with our School Leadership Team. We'll work together on an Attendance Support Plan, agree clear actions and review progress.

Ad Hoc MDSA vacancy

Each week, in this new section of our newsletter, we will focus on a different topic – from what inclusion really means to exploring common needs such as ADHD, autism and dyslexia. Our aim is to give you clear, simple information, share the strategies we use in school and celebrate the strengths which every child brings.

Social, Emotional & Mental Health (SEMH)

Children with SEMH needs may struggle with emotions, relationships or behaviour. This can sometimes look like anger, worry, withdrawal or outbursts in class. Behind these behaviours, there is always a reason — such as difficulty managing feelings, challenges at home or unmet needs. School support includes emotional regulation tools, nurture groups and positive behaviour strategies. With empathy and guidance, children learn healthier ways to cope — and peers learn compassion and resilience.

Workshops for Information, Support and Education (WISE)

Being a parent carer of a child or young person with additional needs can bring extra situations which are challenging to know how to handle. To help support parent carers navigate these, a range of workshops have been created by Somerset Parent Carer Forum based on the subjects you have told them would be helpful. The idea behind the project is to empower parent carers through Workshops for Information, Support and Education.
