

Following that, we talked about our Zones of Regulation and how it is okay to feel big feelings when they take over our bodies, but it is important to know how to manage them. We can feel many things all at once and we coloured in our monsters to represent how we feel today - using the Zones of Regulation colours. We wrote positive affirmations for ourselves and then we posed in our very own Hello Yellow Day Photo Booth! Finally, we exchanged Secret Santa style letters to one another - giving each other compliments.













Zephaniah Class spent the morning exploring their personal mental health and inspired by 'The Beast', they considered the areas they struggle with and how they can keep their minds healthy. This afternoon we listened to our class story, did some yoga and talked about how different types of exercise help us in different ways and then had the opportunity to be social with friends, choosing board games or other activities together.









Important Safeguarding Notice: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the *Spy Dogs*, *Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups* series. Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content. The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

What this means for you:

- If your child has any *Spy Dog*, *Spy Cat* or *Spy Pups* books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.
- > It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves the concern is only with the outdated link.
- We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

We will continue to share updates from the publisher as more information becomes available.

Spotlight on ADHD

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) is a difference in how the brain manages attention, activity and impulses. In class, a child with ADHD may:

- Find it hard to sit still for long.
- Get distracted easily.

Interrupt without meaning to.

This doesn't mean they *can't* focus — often, they focus intensely on things they love! ADHD brains are full of energy, creativity and fresh ideas. Teachers use strategies like movement breaks, chunked instructions and visual reminders. With understanding and support, children with ADHD can thrive both academically and socially.

Children's Eye Health

We have been contacted by the School Vision Screening Service which is commissioned by Somerset Council and provided by the NHS Orthoptic Service in Somerset. As part of the NHS 10 year plan they are focusing on early diagnosis and prevention of sight problems in children. We all know how vital vision is for a child's development and it is important that all those involved in children's development and education know how to best help children in achieving and maintaining good vision.
