Using what you have learnt from the videos above begin creating some doodle characters or flowers – this is an opportunity to experiment so try lots of different ideas out.

If you’re struggling for ideas have a go at the ones from the videos to give you inspiration.



Create your own cartoon

Now you’ve experimented you need to create for your image:

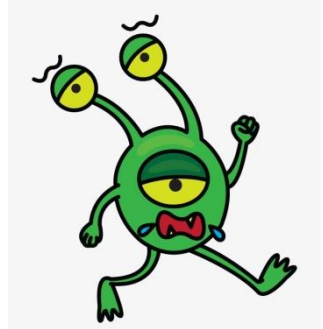
- Will your doodle art be set in space, on the beach, in the park?
- Will you have monster, animal, flower doodles as your characters?

To create your backdrop get imaginative or find an image from a book or the internet and copy it on to a blank piece of paper.



Doodle characters

Now draw your doodle characters on a different piece of paper / card so that once you are finished you can either move them around your background, stick them on to give a 3d effect or using a stop frame animation app you can create a doodle animation out of your doodle picture (remember little movements between each slide creates the best animations).
