In Worship this week, we reflected on the Zones of Regulation. These Zones help us identify our emotions and helps us understand them better by assigning them colours. By improving our understanding of ourselves, we can more easily demonstrate our school values to each other. In our reflection time Bowie class shared their thoughts on the different zones:

- George "Blue means you are sad. When I am sad, I get a bit stressed out but then I do something that makes me relax and that makes me feel better."
- Harvey "Red means you are angry. I feel better when I watch Peppa Pig."
- Jack "Green means you are calm. When I am calm, I really like to sit down and watch telly or my tablet."
- Lola "Yellow means that you don't really know what to do and you're feeling stressed out but not like red. If I am ever feeling yellow, I go upside down on the sofa and count to 30 and then after 30 I take some deep breaths."

Anning Class

This term, Anning class have been focusing on plants and using our scientific knowledge to create pieces of artwork. During our Science lessons we learnt about the parts of the plant and the jobs that those parts have to undertake. In particular the individual parts of the flower, which are responsible for pollination and fertilisation. We also discovered all the clever ways that plants use to disperse their seeds far and wide. We then used our knowledge to create beautiful and unique, giant paper flowers with all the correct parts.

Over the course of a few weeks, during our Art sessions, we sketched flowers, collected ideas and then used a block printing technique to create a repeated, layered print. As you can see, the finished pieces of artwork look amazing and would even make beautiful wrapping paper or wallpaper.
