Love – Week 2



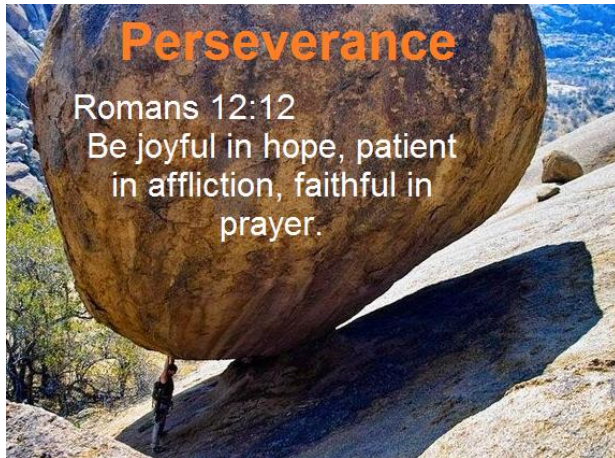
- In the parable of the Good Samaritan - Luke 10 25-37 - Jesus said we should Love our Neighbour, in other words we should care for each other

Perseverance – Week 3



- In the parable of the Lost Sheep - Luke 15 3-6 – Jesus is like the shepherd in the story, and we are like the sheep.
- Jesus watches over us and helps protect us from danger. He doesn't give up on us when we make mistakes.

Reflection Questions:

- Why do you think he didn't give up looking for the sheep?
- Can you think of a time when you didn't give up? What happened?
- How can you show perseverance in your schoolwork or friendships?
- Why is it important to keep trying, even when things are difficult?

Respect – Week 4



- God wants us to think and act in a way that shows others you care about their feelings and well-being
- God has asked us to look after our planet – respect for the environment in our daily lives is key
- In – Jonah 1 – 3 – Jonah didn't respect God's request and tried to run away; eventually he realised he should follow God's commands and by showing God respect helped to save a whole city of people

Reflection Questions:

- Jonah didn't respect God's instructions at first — what happened when he ran away?
- How did Jonah show respect to God when he prayed in the big fish?
- The people of Nineveh listened to God's warning — how did they show respect?
- What can we do each day to show respect to God and to other people?

Harvest - Parable of the sower

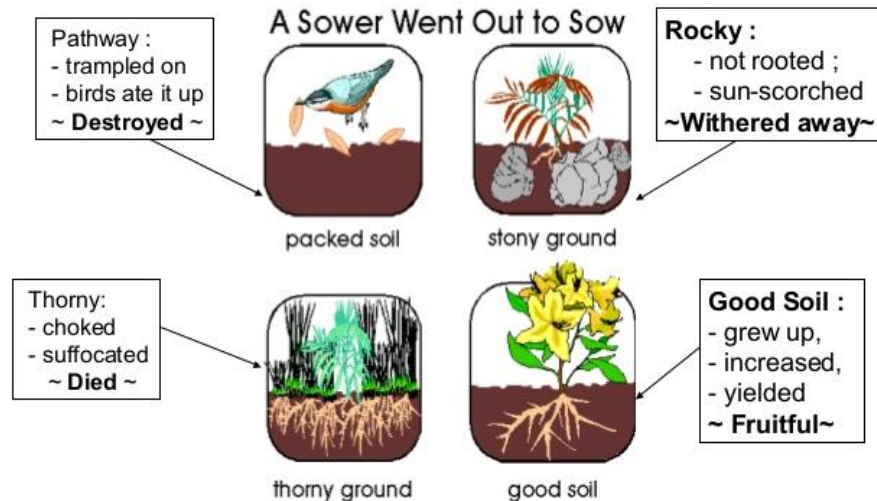
Week 6 (October 6th)

- Receptive to God – we believe and tell others

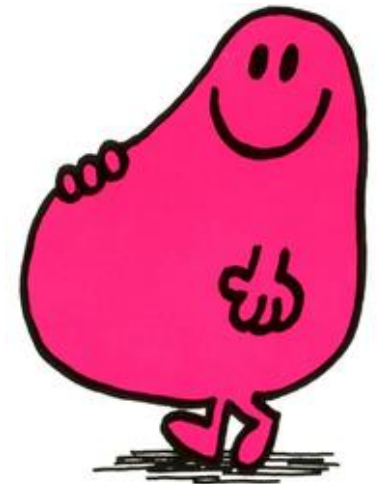


Harvest – Mr Greedy

Week 6

Harvest – sharing God's gifts

- The Widow's Offering (Mark 12: 41–44)
- 41 Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. 42 But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. 43 Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. 44 They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."



Key points:

- God asks us to help others in need.
- When possible we should be givers of our time and gifts.
- We all have special skills and can help others in many ways – this might just be through smiling at someone.

Reflection:

- How can you help others?
- What are your special gifts that you can share?

Ruth

Week 7

Bible passage:

- Ruth 1 to 4 (the whole book)

Key points:

- Ruth and Naomi lost their husbands and became the lowest in their society, widows.
- They lived off the charity of others to survive.
- They remained loyal to God and followed his ways back to good times.

Big Moment:

- Ruth is the Great Great Grandmother of King David and therefore directly related to Jesus.



Reflection:

- Is there a time you have given to others even when it means you miss out?
- What does being loyal to God or others look like for you?

Remembrance

Week 8



- Remembrance Day (next Tuesday) is a special day to remember and honour people who have helped to keep peace and protect us, especially those who served in wars.
- In short we remember the brave people who worked hard to keep us safe.
- We should focus on the values of peace, kindness, and hope for a better future.

Reflection:

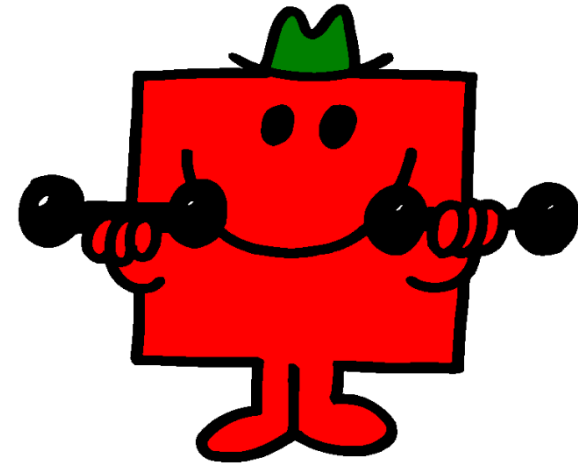
- What or who do you feel is important to remember, and why?

Remembrance – Mr Strong

Week 9

- Joshua 1:9 "Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."



Key Points:

- We all try to do things in our own strength and often fail – the bible says to lean on God for help, Philippians 4:13, 'I can do all things through him who strengthens me.'
- In our singing assemblies we sing the action songs Our God is a great big God and Our God is so big, so strong and so mighty.
- Being strong means we have to protect those that struggle, just as we remember our armed forces protecting others from harm.

Reflection:

- Where does your inner strength come from – who do you lean on when times are hard and you don't feel strong?

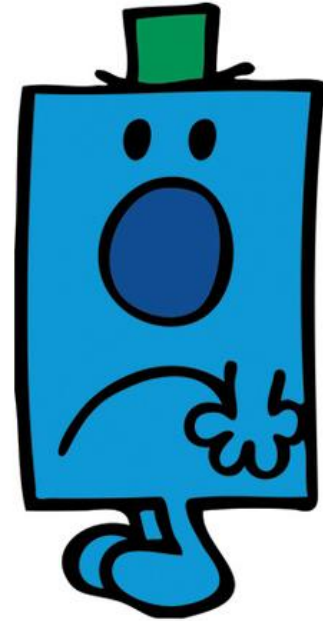
Be a friend week – Mr Grumpy

Week 10

Galatians 5:22-23 – ‘But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!’

Key points:

- Mr Grumpy brings others down – don’t be a drain pulling all the fun and joy from others – be a radiator giving out the fruits of the spirit to others.



Reflection:

- How can we radiate love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control in our lives?
- How can we help others not drain these things from us?

Obedient Joseph – Wk12

Bible passage:

- Matthew 1:18-25

Key points:

- Joseph thought he was doing what was right but God showed him a different path – God calls us to love each other so try to follow his path rather than the worlds
- Through prayer ask God for guidance and he will lead you on the right path
