


KS1 Music Concept and Curriculum Map

Skill Progression Listen to and respond to different kinds of music Complete musical activities that embed pulse, rhythm and pitch Explore using voices and untuned instruments Create your own sounds using instruments Learn a variety of nursery rhymes and familiar songs Learn that songs have sections Learn to start and stop singing when following a leader		 Skill Progression Listen to and respond to different music genres (hip-hop, reggae, blues, baroque, folk, funk, poclassical) Know a minimum of 5 songs off by heart Recognise sounds and names of some instruments Know that music has a steady pulse and demonstrate this through movement, clapping, instruments Create rhythm from words (names, food, colours and animals) Sing notes of different pitches (high and low) Make different types of sounds with voice Start and stop singing when following a leader and to find a comfortable singing position 			

 Play a tuned instrumental part within a song (1-3 notes) Improvise through clapping, lyrics and using a tuned instrument (1-2 notes) Create simple melodies using 1, 3 or 5 different notes Learn that music is composed and can be written down and changed if necessary Perform a learnt song Add ideas to the performance
